Pets age at a rate of five to seven times our aging process. So, twice-yearly exams are very important to their well-being.

A routine check-up allows your veterinarian to identify or prevent medical conditions early, before they become major problems. A senior health screen exam involves laboratory analysis of your pet's bodily functions. These tests help to diagnose blood disorders, kidney, liver disease, diabetes, infection, thyroid disease, and other hormonal problems before they become apparent. Radiographs (x-rays) can help to diagnose heart disease, cancer, and osteoarthritis. *Many times pets are sicker internally than they let us know externally, and a simple physical exam could prove to be a life saver.*
